
You can see that 2015 is off to an exciting start! Thank you for helping us to make this New Year a great one at Nate Mack.

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## Early Childhood News



## Kinder Corner

### Reading

Kindergarten students are working hard to learn all 50 kinder sight words. Students will read fiction and non-fiction stories in reading groups. We will use a variety of strategies to develop comprehension and decoding skills.



### Writing

We will continue to write stories with a topic sentence, supporting detailed sentences and a concluding sentence. Students are using a variety of sources to research information about non-fiction topics and write stories from what they have learned.

### Math

In math kinder students will begin learning addition and subtraction. Students will use objects and pictures to solve story problems and write number sentences. We will also practice math facts 0-5 to develop fluency.

### Social Studies and Science

We will be studying the seasons, animals, and the Five Senses. Students will also learn about Martin Luther King. Students are also learning and practicing the Nate Mack life skills.

Happy New Year! We can't believe how fast the first half of the school year has gone. Our third graders have been very busy reading novels and taking lots of AR quizzes this year. The goal for third graders is to earn 75 points by the end of the school year. Everyone should be reading for 15-30 minutes each night, so that they can reach their AR goal and earn a medal at the end of the year. The students are finishing up their fiction stories and will be starting to write opinion pieces and research in the second semester. Our science focus is the sound unit during the winter months and then we will be learning about plants and crayfish during the spring. It is important to continue practicing multiplication facts with your child nightly, so that they become fluent with their facts by the end of the year. At the end of January the third graders will be attending the musical The Little Mermaid at Green Valley High School. What a great experience this will be for our students!

### Fourth Grade News

Fourth grade reading is working on Drama and plays. The students are enjoying reading about the different dramas and are currently working in groups reading plays. Students are also reading nonfiction text to coincide with Science reading.

In science, we have just finished working with light and energy. The students did many experiments and enjoyed them all. Students found out that when you put a green light with a blue light and a red light that it becomes white. This week we are focusing on space. We will be discussing stars, constellations, different types of stars and what their color means. Students will also be required to write a report about a constellation and work with a partner to create their constellation.

In math, the students are multiplying multi digit numbers by using the area model and partial product. Examples are given on line on the Nate Mack website under 4<sup>th</sup> grade, Ms. Hinton, if there are any questions how to multiply using these methods.

## **Resource Room News**

Welcome back students, and Happy New Year! Students in the resource programs will be continuing to work on a combination of their IEP goals and Common Core Standards in the New Year. Please note that IEP Progress Reports will be sent home with the CCSD Report Card on Friday, January 23, 2015.

### **Tips from Primary Resource - Building Math Skills at Home**

1. Working with flashcards is a simple way to help your child practice and review their basic math facts; addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division.
2. Talk about the calendar with your child. Make it exciting by looking forward to special days or special events. Have them count down the weeks and days until birthdays or see what day of the week a specific holiday will be on this year. Talk to your child about how a calendar is used to keep track of time - days, weeks, months, years, etc.
3. You can help your child learn to count money by playing store with them. Use real coins and let them be the cashier. See if your child can make change for you or show you different sets of coins that equal the same amount.

### **Intermediate Resource Info:**

1. Intermediate Resource Homework consists of Scootpad assignments in Math and ELA (English Language Arts) and RAZ-Kids (online Reading program). Resource students may be assigned all or some of the above depending on IEP goals and academic needs. The next set of assignments will be due on 1/22/15. Upon the due date, parents are asked to sign student's agenda and sign and return the Resource Homework Report. Any questions, please contact Ms. Lopez.
2. In Resource Reading, we are focusing on Biographies. Parents, ask your child to cite some details they have learned about the person we are reading about.

## HOMEWORK SOLUTIONS THAT WORK



Like an actor rehearsing their lines or a batter working on their swing, your child does homework to practice what they learn in school. And if they are like most youngsters, homework brings occasional challenges. Here are solutions to common problems they might face.

### Getting Started

When your child gets home from school or after-school care, they might want to relax for a little while, or may want to jump right in and work. Have them try each method for one week and keep track of how it goes. They could write notes in each day's calendar square. ("Went great!" or "Hard time getting started.") After two weeks, he/she can review  the notes to see which routine worked best.

### Staying Motivated

Does your youngster ever feel restless when they're doing homework? Suggest that they get up and move to a new spot. For example, he /she might finish their vocabulary assignment at the kitchen table and then read their science chapter on the porch. A planned break (say, to have a snack or take a walk) can also give them a second wind.

### Solving Problems

Help your child make a list of strategies he can use when he gets stuck. For a math assignment, he might try tools like a number line or find sample problems in his book. When he's reading, he could look up words in a dictionary or reread a paragraph. Tip: If he's still stumped, he might call a friend or write down his question to ask his teacher the next day.

**"Take Note" Music News**

We have special visitors coming next month! The Brazilian Rugby team! So in order to welcome them we will be learning about music and dance in Brazil. ### Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is a United States federal holiday marking the birthday of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year, which is around the time of King’s date of birth, January 15, 1929. On November 2, 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill making Martin Luther King, Jr. Day a federal holiday as of January 20, 1986. Ronald Reagan’s proclamation of the holiday on January 18, 1986, explained the reason for the holiday: “This year marks the first observance of the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. as a national holiday. It is a time for rejoicing and reflecting. We rejoice because, in his short life, Dr. King, by his preaching, his example, and his leadership, helped to move us closer to the ideals on which America was founded. He challenged us to make real the promise of America as a land of freedom, equality, opportunity, and brotherhood.”
